


Listed among the top 50 women leaders of Washington State

LaNesha DeBardelaben is a visionary public historian and skilled administrator dedicated to transforming society through museums and libraries. With two decades of leadership experience, she has excelled as President & CEO of the Northwest African American Museum, where she spearheaded innovative programming and received notable recognition, including an Emmy nomination. She is only the six woman in U.S. history to have served as National President of the Association of African American Museums Board of Directors.

In addition to her professional achievements, LaNesha is deeply involved in her community, serving as an Assistant Pastor at the historic New Hope Missionary Baptist Church in Seattle and participating actively in organizations like The Links, Incorporated and Alpha Kappa Alpha Sorority, Inc. She also leads the board of the New Hope Community Development Institute, a nonprofit focused on affordable housing and empowerment opportunities for people of color in Seattle's Central District.

LaNesha holds three master's degrees, is pursuing a PhD, and serves as an Adjunct Professor of Museum Studies. With global museum experience in various countries, she continues to make a significant impact in her field and beyond.

LaNesha DeBardelaben is the visionary behind a range of transformative initiatives. These encompass the pioneering African American Cultural Ensemble, the nation's first museum choir, as well as the Knowledge is Power program, which has provided over 20,000 African American children's books to the community.

Her impact as a founder extends to the Descendants Series, showcased on national C-SPAN TV, and the creation of the Elders Circle and James Baldwin Circle. Moreover, she holds the role of co-founder within the influential Black Freedom Collective, a prominent national network.
